DEAR PARENTS

We believe that parents are the primary faith influencers in a child's life and the best discipline making takes place when students' parents or guardians take the lead. We also know how challenging it can be to discipline your child when we're still growing in our own faith. That's why we've created this discipleship activity for you to use at home. It's based on our Discipleship Model and is designed to help you feel confident as you share your faith with your child.

OUR DISCIPLESHIP MODEL

Discipleship is the process of multiplication through relationship, and discipleship takes place when mature believers shape newer believers into committed followers of Jesus Christ. Our Discipleship Model articulates the process of discipleship by outlining the:

Practical steps for you—the disciple maker—to follow.

DISCIPLER'S EXPERIENCE

Emotions & responses these steps might inspire in your child.

DESIRED OUTCOME

Goals for long-term growth in your child's life.





Take a hike as a family to talk about God's creation and your child(ren)'s creativity.

BUILDING MEANINGFUL RELATIONSHIPS LEADS TO

TRUST

Parents, getting outside and taking a hike or even a long walk is an active way to do more than sit and talk with your child(ren).

- Ask your child(ren) what their favorite thing God created is.
- Ask them to look around to find something that shows God's creativity.
- Ask them to tell you specific details of what they choose that show the intentionality of the designer.

Read or have your child(ren) read: Romans 1:20

SHARING PERSONAL STORIES LEADS TO

GRACE

Parents, share with your child(ren):

- Tell your child(ren) about the first time you ever saw them and how you felt.
- Share about the first time you were able to hold them or hear their heartbeat or hold their little hand.
- Talk about how God has made them and created them physically but also share how you see God growing them in creativity.

ASKING INTENTIONAL QUESTIONS LEADS TO

TRUTH

Parents, ask your child(ren) how they see themselves and their creativity and imagination.

- What is one way you think you are creative?
- Is creativity always about art or music? What are some other ways to be creative?
- How have you seen other people's creativity?
- How do you see or understand God's creativity in the world around us?
- How about you? How have you seen God's creativity in you?

MAKING APPLICATIONS WITH ACCOUNTABILITY LEADS TO

CHANGE & OBEDIENCE

Parents, help your child(ren) apply God's truth to everyday life. Ask:

- How can we stop and pause this week to look for God's creativity around us?
- How can I help you develop your creativity and imagination this month?

BE SPECIFIC: *What are you going to do? When are you going to do it? How can we hold each other accountable?*



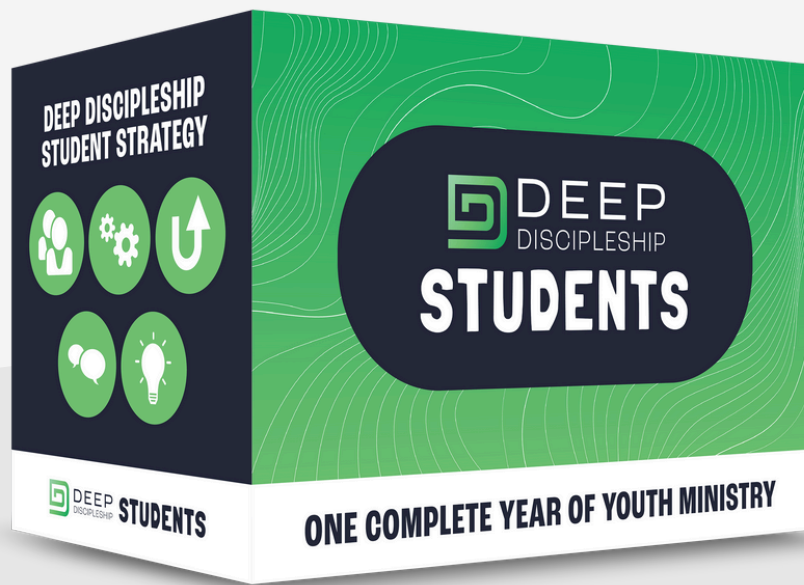
